



Job: Registered nurse

Hours: Full-time permanent (36 hours a week with option for overtime). Example shifts are 8am-2pm and 2pm-8pm (some long shifts 8am-8pm and 8pm-8am).

Salary: £27,100 a year (£14.50 an hour). Overtime £17 an hour

Holidays: 6 weeks a year

Location: Brighton, Folkestone and Croydon

About the role

You'll be in a nursing home environment and it's essential you have the skills to work as part of a team - using a person-centred approach – to assess, plan, implement and evaluate the care delivered.

Level of qualification

You need a minimum of twelve months' post-qualification experience. You must also be registered or in the process of registering with the NMC in the UK (The Nursing and Midwifery Council). Internursing will provide assistance with the UK Nursing Council registration.

To work comfortably and successfully in this role, it's important to be able to communicate well with residents and staff. You, therefore, need B2 (upper-intermediate) English as a minimum level. Ideally you will have C1 level (advanced) for example with an IELTS level 7 certificate.

Preparation for your role:

You'll have four days induction and 18 hours shadowing an experienced nurse.

Professional development:

Victoria Nursing homes is keen to help develop your skills and will offer you training, both in-house and external.

Your main responsibilities will be to:

- provide a high standard of nursing care based on the assessment of care needs and in consultation with the residents, their relatives and the care team
- continuously evaluate the quality of care and regularly reassess the needs of residents
- work in partnership with residents' families and friends in planning, implementing and reviewing care plans
- manage care plans
- work closely with other members of the care team to achieve planned goals
- provide support and professional supervision to care staff and nursing assistants as appropriate
- administer and order medicines
- liaise with GPs (doctors) and other healthcare professionals such as occupational therapists, physiotherapists, community nurses etc
- work within the NMC codes of conduct and Scope of Practice, and the home's policies and procedures (*you will be given training on this*)
- review your nursing practice and develop new skills and knowledge through continuous professional development training
- attend and participate in staff meetings
- make effective and efficient use of all the home's resources
- help residents receive appropriate religious, cultural, emotional and psychological support
